Registration

If you want to be paid to look after children under 8 in England for more than two hours a day, you must register with Ofsted or with an approved Childminder Agency. Registration can be completed in as little as 12 weeks.

What happens next?

Once you've applied to be registered as a childminder, Ofsted will visit your setting to assess and approve your application for registration. This is called a pre-registration visit.

Once you've registered

Congratulations! You're now able to begin your career as a registered childminder, providing high-quality childcare and education for children.

Ofsted registration requires you to hold appropriate public liability insurance (PLI) in place as soon as you are registered. Coram PACEY's Practitioner insurance, arranged and administered by Morton Michel Ltd and underwritten by QBE UK Limited, is designed for childminders, and included in membership. Call us on 0300 003 0005 to get your Coram PACEY membership.

Inspections

All childminders registered on Ofsted's Early Years Register are inspected against the Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS). This is a standard process with clear criteria that Coram PACEY can support with.

New childminders are inspected within 30 months of their registration to ensure the quality of the care they are providing. Inspectors visit the childminder and check that their home is safe and secure.
